## ABOUT THE PROGRAM

For over seventy-five years the Saturday Studios program at Massachusetts College of Art and Design has served a dual purpose: offering elementary through high school students an affordable opportunity to engage in the process of art making and supporting the development of MassArt students as art educators. Courses in a variety of disciplines and media are available by grade level, allowing students to explore and strengthen their creativity and creative problem solving. Classes are taught by MassArt students majoring in art education and supervised by MassArt art education faculty. All classes take place on the MassArt campus, a unique and extraordinary urban college setting devoted exclusively to the visual arts and design.

## WHO IS ELIGIBLE?

All interested students, regardless of their level of experience in art, are eligible to attend. There are no prerequisites or portfolio reviews. There is also a no cost parent/guardian drop-in group each week that provides a wide variety of activities ranging from gallery and museum tours, to guest speakers and art-making sessions. This group provides parents and guardians with a wonderful opportunity to connect with their children on art-related issues.

### SCHOLARSHIPS

Generous support from the Civil Society Institute contributes to the available financial aid for students in need of assistance. Scholarships are available on a first-come, first-served basis. To apply, please submit family financial information on the application form, along with a letter of support from the applicant's art teacher or school principal. A commitment to attend all classes is expected.

**A \$25.00 payment should accompany the application. If the scholarship amount awarded does not meet your financial needs, you will receive your payment back if you respond to the award letter by October 1, 2013.**

## CLASSES OFFERED

### Art Explorations (Grades 4 & 5)

Explore ways of making art using different media and materials. Through drawing, painting, printmaking, clay and more, create artworks tied to one class theme or subject.

### Comic Book Art (Grades 6-8)

Develop and expand a personal style of comic book art using dreams, superheroes and the works of famous artists. Story, character development and drawing techniques are addressed.

### Sculpture (Grades 6-8)

Through a series of fun and innovative exercises, work with fiber, paper, wire, clay, found objects and more to create three dimensional works.

### Painting (Grades 6-8)

Find ways to use color and paint to develop ideas, stories, symbolism, and more. Using water-based paint, experiment with mixing colors, composition, making lines and brush work, working from observation and using your imagination.

### Painting (Grades 9-12)

Use painting as a way to explore complex and essential ideas in art, pop-culture, communication, and history. Work from concepts and observation, using a range of water-based paints to investigate color, composition, texture, line, and form.

### Fashion and Fibers (Grades 7-12)

Explore how artists use cloth, paper and other materials. Using techniques that may include sewing, printing on fabric, beading, papermaking, batik, knitting, weaving and more, make wearable art and 3D objects from a wide range of soft media.

### Mixed-Media Sculpture (Grades 9-12)

Examine how space, form, movement, scale, color, and texture can be used to create expressive three-dimensional works of art. Find strategies to conceive work, bring it to completion, and examine how contemporary sculptors use their craft to comment on life and culture in funny and serious ways. Wire, clay, wood, cardboard, and found objects, in addition to more contemporary media such as light, sound, and digital content are some of the materials and media used.

### Drawing in the 21st Century (Grades 9-12)

Explore traditional and innovate ways of drawing in a variety of media. For students interest in personal artistic development or strengthening portfolios for college admissions.

### Animation (Grades 9-12)

Learn about animation and all of its possibilities. Using a variety of approaches, from storyboards, flip books, and comic books to high-tech digital and video, develop drawing techniques to tell stories in still and moving images.

**NOTE:** Additional \$85 lab fee required.

### Photography (Grades 9-12)

Learn black and white photography techniques including film development, camera operation, and composition. Students need to bring their own 35mm cameras.

**NOTE:** Additional \$85 lab fee required.

### The Figure (Grades 11 & 12)

Explore traditional and innovative ways to work from the human figure. Study the figure as a dynamic form through a variety of creative exercises with an emphasis on gestural work. The course may be used to strengthen portfolios for college application. A variety of media and styles are presented. Parental consent is required due to use of nude models.

### Advanced Studios (Grades 11 & 12)

Review and expand your portfolio. Using both observation and imaginative approaches, refine ways to express personal intention in both two and three-dimensional form. Parental consent is required due to the possible use of nude models.
